In our Monday morning assemblies, we have been playing a different Beatles song each week. This has included Blackbird, Hey Jude and Octopus's Garden. ParentHub and the My Child At School app

After discussions with the Trust, we have decided to move our communications platform to the My Child At School app which is already used by most parents for school dinners and breakfast/after-school clubs. Obviously, this will bring with it a cost saving for the school, but we hope to retain our ability to communicate with you about school life in an easy-to-use manner. From next week we will be trialling the My Child At School app with Miss Wilde's Class 4 so that we can work through any teething problems that we may find. Parent Survey Results - Breakfast Club and After School Club - NO DEBT POLICY

What was striking in our parent survey was how valued the wraparound provision is for our families. You were very complimentary about the staff that run the clubs and you are grateful for the service that they provide. There has recently been a cost increase from our food supplier but there will not be any change in the pricing of these clubs until September. In the meantime, I will be reviewing our offering and organisation of the wraparound care to ensure that it is run in a way that provides fair value to both our families and the school. Linked to this, we will also be operating a NO DEBT POLICY from September 2024. Essentially this means that you will need to pay in advance for school dinners and clubs rather than retrospectively. I believe this in the best interests of all concerned. If you do have a notable debt to the school, please start by chipping away at this over the remaining 18 school weeks left this year. If you are worried about being able to clear your debt in this timeframe, please do get in touch and we will look to support you where we possibly can.
